Major/Minor and Level System

Important Information

- The Major/Minor chart is a tool to recognise what observable behaviour equates to a major or minor.
- Minor behaviour is low level behaviour where consequences are teacher managed.
- Major behaviour is behaviour that can place students onto a level. These consequences can be teacher managed with executive support, or executive managed, depending on the severity of the incident.
- Major behaviours are those that progress students onto a level after <u>2 incidents</u>. E.g. a student has 1 major incident. A level warning letter is given. After this letter is given, the student is then a part of another major incident. This student may then be pushed onto a Level. This level is dependent on the severity of the incident.
- If you deem an incident to be a major or Level 1/2 or 3 behaviour, and require executive support, it is the teachers responsibility to gather information as necessary and input all information into School Bytes. The consequence may be dealt with by a teacher with executive support, or an executive staff member.
- If a Level 1 or 2 behaviour (Major Behaviour) exhibited for the **first time**, a student will:
 - Miss 2 consecutive break periods (break 1 2 days in a row) with the teacher who dealt with the incident
 - Level 1 warning letter sent home (AP Responsibility)
- If Level 1 or 2 behaviour (Major Behaviour) is exhibited for a **second time**, students may be placed directly onto a level. This is at executive discretion.
- If a student demonstrates a Level 3 behaviour for the first time, they can be placed onto a level at executive discretion.
- 6 minor incidents in a term equate to a Level 1.
- Contact ARCO if you require support for racial and discriminative incidents.

Disruption	Low intensity but inappropriate disruption - talking while others are speaking - inappropriate sounds and actions - calling out - intentionally interfering with games/activities	Persistent behaviour that causes interruption to school activities - repeatedly interrupting others (L1) - deliberately interrupting others (L1)		
Defiance, Non- Compliance and Disrespect	Brief or low intensity disrespectful behaviours - rude gestures eg. eye rolling, comment under breath, poking out tongue - out of bounds - running in the classroom - littering - playing without a hat	Repeated refusal and/or ignoring of staff directions or school expectations - threatening staff and others (L2) - repeated refusal to comply with instructions (L2) - arguing with staff (L2) - hiding from the teacher (L2) - leaving school grounds and/or teacher supervised areas without permission (L2)		
Property Misuse	Low intensity misuse of personal/school property - inappropriate use of equipment and belongings eg. snatching, throwing, flicking hats, pulling clothes, books and	Deliberate damage or misuse of personal/school property - destruction or permanent disfigurement of property (L2)

Identity means gender, age, ethnicity, language, food, family, sexuality, home, religion, occupation.

Level System (Executive Managed)

- It is an **Assistant Principal/Deputy Principal/Principal's** role to put a student on a level.
- Students being placed on a level should have previously had a phone call home regarding their behaviour by the Classroom Teacher or Assistant Principal.
- It is the role of the Assistant Principal/Deputy Principal/Principal to send out the level letter and inform the parents a student is on a level.
