Overview

Tullimbar Public School is committed to explicitly teaching and modelling positive behaviour and to supporting all students to be engaged with their learning. Key programs prioritised and valued by the school community are:

- You Can Do It
- Berry Street Education Model
- Zones of Regulation
- Second Step
- School Chaplain Program

Promoting and reinforcing positive student behaviour and school-wide expectations

Tullimbar Public School has the following school-wide rules and expectations:

- Be Safe
- Be Sensible
- Be Kind
- Be Respectful

Tullimbar Public School uses the following strategies and systems to explicitly teach, recognise and reinforce positive student behaviour and behavioural expectations:

- You Can Do It Awards are linked with the 5 keys for success (resilience, persistence, getting along, organisation and confidence). Teachers award 2 You Can Do It awards at each assembly, directly linked to the value of the fortnight.
- Bronze, Silver, Gold and Platinum Awards are earned by students for demonstrating the 5 keys to success. Achievement of these awards earns the ability to participate in an end of year reward day.

• Tullimbar Public School utilises a 'major' and 'minor' approach to behaviour. Major and minor behaviours are clearly defined, and resolutions are achieved through restorative practices. Management of major and minor behaviours are underpinned by the TPS Level System.
